NEVADA STATE BARBER'S HEALTH and SANITATION BOARD



Minutes – April 7, 2019 – Regular Business Meeting

President Nathaniel LaShore called the meeting to order on Sunday, April 7, 2019, the time was 3:00 P.M. at the Masterpiece Barber College, located at 3510 East Bonanza Road, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Board members Ms. Nancy Hathaway, Mr. Nathaniel LaShore, and Ms. Antinette Maestas and Mr. Johnnie Williams and Mr. Ishan Azzam.

The agenda was reviewed and approved as posted.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes for the January 27, 2019 Business Meeting and the March 4, 2019 Special Meeting since everyone had copies and they had been read. The motion included to accept the minutes as submitted. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the 3rd quarter financial report, Mr. Williams seconded and all was in favor.

Officers Report

1. Ms. Hathaway reported that she has been busy up North. They are doing all inspections.
2. Mr. LaShore reported that he has been doing business as usual. Staying busy inspecting.
3. Mr. Johnnie Williams has been busy and he has been doing inspections.
4. Mr. Ihsan Azzam had nothing to report.

Old Business –

Instructor's Exam – Ms. Maestas states that there is an Instructor's Exam scheduled for April 22, 2019 and there is 1 candidate testing for that.

Ms. Maestas reported that the Mid Winter Conference was very good. There were several things learned and time spent on planning the Annual Conference for September that will be held in Reno, Nevada.

New Business

Ms. Maestas swore all the individuals for hearing in.

Spencer Lawson – Mr. Lawson came before the Board with a felony, he is represented by his Attorney Mark Peplowski Nevada Bar number 7133. Mr. Lawson wants to go to school. His felony was December 24, 2016. The felony was for domestic violence strangulation. Mr. Lawson stated that the strangulation came from putting his ex-wife in a head lock. Mr. Lawson went to prison January 2017 and was released June 12, 2018 with an expired sentence discharge. Was married to a woman with many problems in the relationship. Mr. Lawson had come before the Board with another felony prior. The Board cleared him for that felony. Mr. Peplowski stated that this was problems with this marriage since day one. Mr. Williams made a motion to allow Mr. Spencer to attend school, Ms. Hathaway amended the motion to be put in that if Mr. Lawson gets into any trouble from here forward his license if licensed will be pulled. Ms. Hathaway seconded that motion and all was in favor.

Ray Perkins hearing – Mr. Perkins wants to go to school and has a felony on his record. In 2009 he was incarcerated for possession he was in for about a year. The case is closed. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Perkins to go to school providing he agrees to random drug testing. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Derek Hann hearing – Mr. Hann came before the Board to be able to attend school in the State of Nevada. He does have a felony on his record. In December 2015 he got the felony for robbery. He did 3 months in a boot camp. Mr. Williams made a motion to allow Mr. Hann to attend school, Ms. Hathaway seconded the motion.

Jonathan Matos hearing – Mr. Matos came before the board because he has a felony on his record. The felony was for establishing a financial lab. He was trying to make money and never used it. He did have a domestic violence on his record. He is on probation and attending domestic classes. He will be done in August of 2020. He has several reference letters. He is on probation his officer is Tyler Johnson and phone number is 702-486-3001. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to attend school, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion all was in favor.

Terrence Stanley hearing – Mr. Gavay came before the board because he wants to go to school. He got a felony for burglary January 7, 2013. He did probation only and was honorably discharged June 29, 2015. Mr. Williams made a motion to allow him to attend school, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Alex Haines – Mr. Haines came before the Board to be able to attend school in the State of Nevada. He has a felony on his record. February 26, 2015 he was charged with battery with a deadly weapon. He served 24 months in prison. He did his GED, anger management and impulse control with in prison. He was released with an honorable discharge. Mr. Williams made a motion that he be allowed to attend school, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Jose Figueroa – Mr. Figueroa came before the Board to be able to attend school. He was convicted of 3 felonies in 2006 they were robbery, burglary, and conspiracy of robbery, he served 4 years in prison and was released November 2012. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to attend school. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Arphaxad Carroll– Mr. Carroll came before the Board to be able to attend school. He was convicted of conspiracy to distribute in 2005, he was released 2010. He does many good things in the community today and feels he is rehabilitated. He has numerous letters from people in the community. Mr. Williams made a motion to allow him to attend school, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Jemima Gutierrez – Ms. Gutierrez came before the board because she was dismissed from the January 2019 exam for cheating. She wants to be able to take the exam again. A letter was read from the proctor that caught her cheating. She was dismissed from the exam. The board asked her if she was able to take the exam without a translator. The instructor of her school told the board that she went through school without a translator and took all her test in school in English. She told the board that she could take the exam in English. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow her to retake the exam in English, Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

James Gaston– Mr. Gaston came before the Board to be able to take the exam in Nevada. He applied to take the exam and the application was found to be fraudulent. He had notarized affidavits to show he was working in a barber shop in California and according to the California state Board he was not licensed during those dates. He states that he was working in a barber shop and going to school. He explained that he was counting the time he worked as a student. Ms. Maestas asked him if he had tax returns that would prove that he had the experience needed. He stated that he has never filed taxes since he started barbering. He states that he was working in Nevada as a barber unlicensed. He was told that he should have never went to work without a license. If he can produce paperwork from school showing his schooling he would qualify to take the Apprentice exam but tried to take the registered exam instead. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to take the Apprentice exam. He would have to start the application process over. Mr. Williams seconded the motion, and all was in favor.

Dru Frommer – Mr. Frommer came before the Board because he has gone over a year in school. He wants to be able to take the examination. He explained that the reasoning for being over 1 year in school is because he has medical reasons. He had documentation from the doctor. He is on medication but is feeling better. He has approximately 2 months left of school. He originally started school January 2018 withdrew in August 2018 reinstated in January 2019. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to exam and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Anthony Eidem – Mr. Eidem came before the board with a citation. He also says his application to take the exam was denied. Ms. Maestas asked if he could start with the citation first. On April 4, 2019 he was issued a citation for NRS 643.190 advertising as a barber shop without having a barber licensed there. Mr. Eidem stated that the salon is licensed as a Cosmetology salon. He stated that the Cosmetology board issued him a citation and he paid it. He feels that he is being played by both. Ms. Maestas stated that Mr. Eidem had called her several times yelling and screaming and told her that he was opening a shop and the board could just fine him. Ms. Maestas read complaint letters from different barbers wanting to know why he is operating a barber shop without a license. He stated that he had worked with Ms. Hathaway and she stated she has text messages and emails from him. She stated that she would remain quit and let him talk. He was asked if he had a shop application he states that he turned it in. Ms. Hathaway stated that he never turned it in. She asked him who was the master barber and he said he was. He was told that he could not be the manager because he is not licensed. He was asked

what he was here for today. He wants the fine to be dropped. On January 23, 2019 he received the citation for advertising as a barbershop. Mr. Williams makes a motion that the fine stands as is. Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor. Mr. LaShore moved on what he needs to do to be licensed. Mr. LaShore explained to him the process of the application to get licensed as a barber. Ms. Maestas asked him when the salon was opened. Ms. Hathaway stated that the City of Reno has him licensed as a barber shop which he is not. Ms. Maestas went over the time line she stated that December 20, 2018 Mr. Eidem went into the Reno office and picked up a barber application, Ms. Hathaway wrote on the paper that the application was for a possible January 27, 2019 exam she also put on the paper that the fee for a temporary license was \$60. Ms. Hathaway called the office in Vegas and was told that the deadline was December 15, 2018 for the January exam. He would have to take the April exam. On January 28, 2019 Ms. Maestas received a packet from Mr. Eidem for a temporary license, she sent him a letter stating we could not issue a temporary license until we had a completed application on file. She gave him the law and he said nowhere could he find the law. Ms. Maestas stated that his application was missing his transcripts from high school and a paid up barbers license from California. Ms. Maestas also stated that he did not get affidavits from where he worked. She told him they would accept tax returns. With what he provided he does not have 5 years within the last 10 years. Ms. Maestas went over what she had she explained was missing 2 tax records. Mr. Eidem asked while he is waiting can he was told that we cannot issue a temporary license until there is a completed application on file. Ms. Maestas stated that all that is needed is 2 tax returns and pay the fine that was issued. Mr. Eidem stated he would get the 2 years tax returns and he would pay the fine. He was told money order or cashier's check. He asked if he got a temporary could he be a manager in charge. He was told no. He was told that he would he could not work in the salon with a barber license.

Royal Byron – Mr. Byron came before the Board for approval on second location for a barber school. Ms. Maestas gave the floor plans to the Board. Mr. Byron sent them in. 3528 South Maryland Parkway Suite 204 this is in the Boulevard Mall. Mr. Byron was asked when he planned on opening he stated he did not have a set date but about 30-60 days. There are 4200 square feet. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to accept the location and Mr. Williams seconded the motion. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Byron to turn the application in to the office along with everything in NRS 643.174 that is required. Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor. Mr. Byron was also told that he would have to have enough instructors to cover both schools and the Board would need the names of instructors at each school.

Carlos Diaz– Mr. Diaz did attend the hearing. He was issued an Apprentice license on 06/16/2017 and should have taken the January 2019 or April, 2019 exam and did not take either. He did come in the office after the deadline. Ms. Hathaway asked if he could have the completed application turned in by Friday April 12, 2019 he said yes. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to let him keep his license providing he turned in a completed application by April 12, 2019 for the June exam. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Nicholas Hatheway - Mr. Hatheway did attend the hearing. He was issued an Apprentice license on 06/15/2017 and should have taken the January 2019 or April, 2019 exam and did not take either. He did come in the office after the deadline. Ms. Hathaway asked if he could have the completed application turned in by Friday April 12, 2019 he said yes. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to let him keep his license providing he turned in a completed application by April 12, 2019 for the June exam. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

John Bryant – Mr. Bryant did not show for the hearing. He was issued an Apprentice license on 9/11/15 he took the exam for registered barber August 2017. But it has been over 1 year. He did not renew his license at renewal time. Ms. Hathaway made a motion not to renew his license until he takes the registered exam, Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Eric Snyder, Paris Maxwell, and Joshua Aceves no showed for hearing.

Treika Sprague, Vanna Chou, Ashley-Marie Cornelio, Nicholas Karel, Todd Elliott, Jonathan Duffin, Juan Medina, Juan Kuraica, and D’Andre Lampkin took the exam and no need to hear them.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.


Ms. Hathaway made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Mr. Williams seconded and all was in favor.

There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned.






