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NEVADA STATE BARBER'S HEALTH and SANITATION BOARD



Minutes – January 29, 2017 – Regular Business Meeting & Public Hearing

President Nathaniel LaShore called the meeting to order on Sunday, January 29, 2017, the time was 2:00 P.M. at the Masterpiece Barber College, located at 3510 East Bonanza Road, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Board members Ms. Nancy Hathaway, Mr. Nathaniel LaShore, Mr. Ihsan Azzam, and Ms. Antinette Maestas. Ms. JoAnna Wesley-Winn was absent.

The agenda was reviewed and approved as posted.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes for the October 2, 2016, since everyone had copies and they had been read. The motion included to accept the minutes as submitted. Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the financial report since everyone has a copy and read the report. Ms. Maestas stated that there are 2 financial reports July 1, 2016 through September 30, 2016 and October 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to approve both reports, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Officers Report

1. Ms. Hathaway reported that she has been busy up North. She states that there is a lot of positivity for the new and changes to the NAC being changed. There have been a couple of new shops opened and they are growing up North.
2. Mr. LaShore reported that he has been doing business as usual. Just continuing to inspect shops. Still finding people willing to work unlicensed. We are growing in the south also.
3. Ms. Wesley-Winn not in attendance for meeting or for testing she was sick.
4. Mr. Azzam that he sees good quality in this Board. He reviewed the amendments in the changes to the NAC's and found them to be done very well.

Old Business -

New Business

Marcus Wells-Curry – Mr. Wells-Curry came before the Board to be able to go to school in Nevada. Mr. Wells-Curry received a felony in 2008 for selling drugs in Michigan. He did 2 ½ years in prison. He was released with an honorable discharge in 2010. All his paperwork was in order. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Wells-Curry to attend Barber School providing he submits to random drug testing. He will have to have a drug test before he starts school. Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Eric Marshall hearing – Mr. Marshall came before the Board to be able to attend barber school in Nevada. He has a felony on his record. In 2006 his felony was for pandering and a possession felony in 2010. He had no paperwork on these felonies. He must resubmit to a hearing and come back with paperwork. He was informed of the next hearing date and deadline date.

Diallo Hall hearing – Mr. Hall came before the Board to be able to attend barber school in Nevada. He has a felony on his record and wants to attend Barber School. His felonies were 1999, 2002, and 2012. He claims everything will clear from California. He is the middle of clearing all of this. His mother-in-law spoke to understand what he needed. She said she will help him. He must resubmit to a hearing and come back with paperwork. He was informed of the next hearing date and deadline date.

Priscella Saintal-Smith hearing – Ms. Saintal-Smith came before the Board to be able to attend barber school in Nevada. She has a felony on her record. In 2006 she received a felony for grand larceny. She served 10 years in prison, and did several programs while incarcerated. She is on lifetime probation. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Ms. Saintal-Smith to attend barber school, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Marcus Graham hearing – Mr. Widders came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. He received a felony in 2013 for robbery, he served 3 years in prison and was released August 24, 2016. He is on probation until August 2017. His probation officer is Officer Paddy, 702-486-3051. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Graham to attend barber school. Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Greggory Johnson hearing – Mr. Johnson came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. He received a felony in 2011 for possession of controlled substance. He did 2 days in county jail, he attended an inpatient drug program in San Diego. The case was closed September 2012. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Johnson to attend barber school providing he subject to a random drug test, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Damon Barnes hearing – Mr. Barnes came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. He received felonies in 2003 for possession of stolen firearms, in 2006 for trafficking and possession, and 2014 for dui/possession. He went into prison May of 2014 and was released November 2015. All his paperwork seemed to be in order and Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to attend school providing that he submits to a drug test, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Jared Finley Sr. hearing – Mr. Finley came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. He received a felony November 2014 for pandering and battery. He was released July 28, 2016. He did several classes while incarcerated to clear his mind and get him right with himself. Mr. Azzam made a motion to allow him to attend school, Ms. Hathaway seconded and all was in favor.

Devin Noyes hearing – Mr. Noyes came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. He received 6 felonies all in one case. In October 2010 he was charged with drug possession and distributing. This was all in Utah. He was in July 2012, and released from parole January 2014. Mr. Azzam made a motion to allow Mr. Noyes to attend school providing Mr. Noyes submits to drug testing, Ms. Hathaway seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Christopher Porter hearing – Mr. Porter came before the Board to be able to attend barber school. He has a felony on his record. June of 2013 he received a felony for battery with a deadly weapon. He was defending himself. He served 2 years, and was released June of 2015. He has a complete discharge. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to attend barber school, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Jason McDaniel hearing – Mr. McDaniel came before the Board to be able to test in Nevada as a Barber. He has a felony on his record. He has 3 felonies on his record. He needs to finish school he started in Ohio but had to quit. In 2003 he had theft possession and served 1 year, In 2007 robbery he served 2 year, and 2012 drug possession, he served 1 year. He was released from prison 2014. Mr. Azzam made a motion to allow him to finish school providing he submits to random drug testing, Ms. Hathaway seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Darryn Orozco hearing – Mr. Orozco came before the Board to be able to test in Nevada as a Barber. He has a felony on his record. He received a felony October 2008 for battery with a deadly weapon. He served 3 ½ years in prison. He was discharged June of 2012. He is completely finished. Mr. Azzam made a motion to allow him to attend school, and Ms. Hathaway seconded the motion, all was in favor.

D'Andre Lampkin hearing – Mr. Lampkin came before the Board to request to exam in Nevada. Regarding NAC 643.660. Mr. Lampkin has gone over the 1 year time limit to finish school. He started school January 2016. Due to a financial hardship, and some sickness he got pneumonia, and his mom is ill, he will not be finished within a year. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to finish school and test, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Charles Turner hearing – Mr. Turner came before the Board to request to exam in Nevada. Regarding NAC 643.660. Mr. Turner has gone over the 1 year time limit to finish school. He ran into some financial problems due to the fact that his mother got very ill and he had to help the family out. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to finish school and test, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

Denise Escobar hearing – Ms. Escobar came before the Board regarding expired apprenticeship. Ms. Escobar has had some issues finishing her apprenticeship. She lives in a rural area. She is a single mom and cannot leave the town. She said she would go back to school if need be. She now has a job in Winnemucca. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow her to finish her apprenticeship, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Royal Byron hearing – Mr. Byron came before the Board to share new technology to Nevada Barber College. Mr. Byron shared with the Board that he will start a new time keeping system. Mr. Byron was asked how the student were clocking in with this system. He told the board that they clock in with their student numbers. He was asked if each student was clocking themselves in and out. Mr. Byron told the board that yes each student was clocking in and out on their own. He told the board that sometimes they forget to clock in or out and Ms. Hathaway told him that after a time or 2 of not getting hours they will remember. Mr. Byron told the board that this system will be used not the next time sheets but the following time sheets. Mr. Byron told the board that he feels oppressed by the board not using his school for testing. He said there was a meeting in December that he could not attend, and this was discussed and Ms. Hathaway said that the board was opened up to using any facility that would meet the needs of the Board for testing purposes. Mr. LaShore explained that, as our examinations have grown we have had to change locations to keep up with the larger number of applicants testing. When Mr. Byron was putting in his school, Mr. LaShore told Mr. Byron if he would put a sink in for every chair, they may be able to use the school for exams. Mr. Byron told the board at the time of putting in the school it was too costly. He feels that his school meets the needs for the testing. Ms. Maestas told him that with the wall that is down the middle of the school blocks the view for examiners to be able to see all candidates at one time. Mr. Byron told the board that with social media he feels that there is competition. Ms. Hathaway told him that has nothing to do with the Board. He said he feels the Board is not being fair. Ms. Hathaway told him that we are here to do a job and we have to do what is best for the candidates being tested. Mr. Byron asked what was needed to be able to hold exams at his school. He wants the board to get back to him, Ms. Hathaway asked what is the solution to the problem? Mr. Byron said he didn't know but wanted the Board to get back to him. Ms. Maestas asked what does the Board want in this letter? Mr. Byron said he would write a letter to the Board and the Board said they would respond to the letter.

Permission to schedule instructor's exam – Ms. Maestas stated that there she has applicants wanting to take the instructor exam. She needs permission to schedule through NIC. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to schedule instructor's exam through NIC, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.

NABBA mid-winter conference – NABBA will hold their mid-winter conference February 17-20, 2017 in Tampa Florida. Ms. Hathaway stated that the NABBA asked her to serve on a committee. Mr. LaShore explained that this Board has always benefited from this Association. Mr. Azzam made a motion to allow members to attend this meeting. Ms. Hathaway seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Public Comment

Mr. Marcus Allen of Masterpiece Barber College wanted to say for the record, that he does not feel that the Barber Board has given him any special privilege. He followed all laws when opening his school.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Mr. Azzam seconded. All was in favor.

The Board will take a 10 minute break and then will resume to the Public Workshop.

President LaShore called the Public Workshop back to order at 4:00 P.M. after a 10 minute break.

Each NAC was read by Ms. Maestas.

1. Proposed changes to NAC 643.010 – change 12th grade to high school diploma.

NAC 643.010 Apprentice: Qualifications for examination. (NRS 643.050)

1. An applicant for examination for a license as an apprentice must:

- (a) Have completed the ~~12th grade~~ high school diploma or the equivalent;
- (b) Have completed 1,500 hours of instruction in a barber school approved by the board; and
- (c) Be an American citizen or lawfully entitled to live and work in the United States.

2. If the applicant has ever been convicted of a felony, he must appear before the board for a hearing to determine whether he will be permitted to take the examination. A convicted felon has the burden of showing that a license should be issued. The board will consider the date of conviction, the nature of the crime, the applicant's record of rehabilitation, the applicant's experience since conviction, personal and employment references and any other evidence which the board deems relevant.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., part Rule 24, eff. 10-8-70; A 6-1-74; 7-16-77; 2-26-80]—(NAC A by R084-99, 1-18-2000)

This NAC is being changed due to the fact that there are now certificates of attendance. When this was written years ago it was the intent of the Board for an applicant to graduate from high school.

2. Proposed changes to NAC 643.070 – change \$90 to \$100 in accordance to NRS 643.090.

NAC 643.070 Fee for examination. The fee for an examination is ~~\$90~~ \$100.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 30, eff. 10-8-70; A 7-10-72]—(NAC A 9-16-92)

This language has not been updated. There is no increase NRS says \$100.

3. Proposed changes to NAC 643.150 – in accordance to NRS 643.130

NAC 643.150 Temporary permits. ~~Temporary permits to practice barbering in this state will not be issued.~~ The fee for a temporary permit is \$60.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 34, eff. 10-8-70]

This is old language. Temporary permits did not use to be allowed. They have been allowed for several years.

4. Proposed changes to NAC 643.160 – #2 change fee from \$50 to \$60 and #3 change fee from \$100 to \$120 in accordance with NRS 643.140.

NAC 643.160 Fees: Proration of initial fee; renewal or restoration of license. (NRS 643.050, 643.140)

1. The initial fee paid by an apprentice or a barber for a license issued not more than 6 months before its renewal date may be prorated at the rate of \$3 per month.

2. A licensed barber or apprentice may renew his license by paying a fee of ~~\$50~~ \$60

3. A barber or an apprentice whose license has been expired for less than 2 years may restore it by paying the restoration fee of ~~\$100~~ \$120.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 35, eff. 10-8-70; A 1-6-72; 8-31-79; 10-20-81; + Rule 39, eff. 10-8-70; A 1-6-72; 11-9-79; 10-20-81]—(NAC A 5-19-88; 9-16-92; R084-99, 1-18-2000)

This is old language. According to the NRS says up to \$60 for renewal, this was increased to \$60 several years ago and never got changed in the NAC. The same goes for restoration fee, this was increased several years ago when the license fee was changed, it never got changed in the NAC.

5. Proposed change to NAC 643.230 – change from 1 apprentice to 2 apprentices.

NAC 643.230 Limitation on number of apprentices employed. (NRS 643.050)

Each barber may employ apprentices in the ratio of ~~one~~ two apprentice to each licensed barber working in the barbershop, but may not employ more than six apprentices in a shop.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 22, eff. 10-8-70; A 9-6-76]—(NAC A by R084-99, 1-18-2000)

This is being changed from 1 to 2 apprentice barbers per registered barbers. The reasoning for this is because we are growing and it will be easier for apprentice barbers to find jobs.

6. Proposed removal of NAC 643.340 – removal of clean cuspidors.

~~NAC 643.340 Cuspidors and ashtrays. Cuspidors and ashtrays must be cleaned every day, and a disinfectant must be left in cuspidors at all times.~~

~~[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 5, eff. 10-8-70] (NAC A 5-19-88)~~

This is being changed for old language. No one has cuspidors in barber shops anymore.

7. Proposed changes to NAC 643.350 – modification to waste receptacles.

NAC 643.350 Waste receptacles. ~~A At least two covered waste receptacles must be provided for each barber's chair. All single use items including neck strips must be discarded immediately after a single use. Used shaving papers must be deposited in one receptacle and used towels must be deposited in the other.~~

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 6, eff. 10-8-70]

This is being changed from 2 covered waste receptacles to 1. There will be a covered garbage can at each station and the towel bin will be in a central location within the shop.

8. Proposed changes to NAC 643.355 – removal of dry fumigant and add updated language.

NAC 643.355 ~~Sterilization~~ Disinfection of implements. All non-porous implements must be cleaned and disinfected prior to each use by the following steps:

1. Each item must be cleaned with soap or detergent and water and rinsed. Blade wash is an acceptable cleaner for this step.
2. Item(s) must be fully immersed (including handles) in an EPA registered disinfectant that is bactericidal, virucidal and fungicidal. Disinfectant must be used in accordance with the manufactures label, including contact time. EPA registered disinfectants that are in a spray or wipe form are also acceptable if manufactures label instructions are followed.
3. Items must be rinsed and dried with a clean towel or allowed to air dry.

~~For each barber's chair in a barbershop, there must be provided:~~

~~—1. A container of sufficient depth for the immersion of those implements listed in paragraph (f) of subsection 1 of NRS 643.200. The container must contain a solution of not less than 4 percent formalin or 5 percent phenol or the equivalent.~~

~~—2. An airtight cabinet sterilizer which must be equipped with:~~

~~—(a) A small glass tray containing 1 tablespoon of borax and 1 tablespoon of formaldehyde or three formaltabs or the equivalent maintained at full strength at all times; or~~

~~—(b) Germicidal lamps.~~

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 13, eff. 10-8-70]

Electric Implements

1. Remove hair and other debris.
2. Use EPA registered disinfectant spray or wipe that is bactericidal, virucidal and fungicidal according to the manufactures label, including contact time.

3. Wipe dry with clean towel.

Storage of Implements,

1. When items have been properly disinfected, they must be stored in a clean, covered container or drawer until used.
2. Electrical implements may be stored on hooks, stands or a clean covered container or closed drawer.
3. No implements may be carried in clothing, tool belts or pockets.

This is being changed because of the dri fumigant no longer being manufactured. It is also proven now that formaldehyde is dangerous to humans. Everything that is underlined is all new language. We do not sterilize in the barbershop we only sanitize and disinfect. This gives directions for each step of sanitizing and disinfecting and storage of implements. The Board did get help on this language from Kings Research.

9. Proposed changes to NAC 643.380 – Adding updated language.

NAC 643.380 Used towels. A covered and vented receptacle shall be available for depositing used towels. Towels may only be used once before being laundered. A fresh towel must be used for each client. A used towel which is left on or near any washbowl, basin, workstand or place other than in the proper receptacle will be considered prima facie evidence of an intent to use the towel without it being relaundered.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 9, eff. 10-8-70]

This is being changed because we took out 2 receptacles at the station, you will have a covered and vented storage for used towels.

10. Proposed removal of NAC 643.390 – In more than once

~~**NAC 643.390 Containers for hair.** Hair must be kept in a separate closed container before disposal.~~

~~[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 14, eff. 10-8-70]~~

This is being removed because it is in NAC twice.

11. Proposed changes to NAC 643.315 – Adding updated language.

NAC 643.415 Prohibition against removal of warts, moles and blemishes. Barbers and apprentices may not remove by any method, warts, moles or skin blemishes of any kind. Barbers shall not perform a service when the area to be worked on has skin that is open, reddened, ulcerated or swollen.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule 18, eff. 10-8-70]

This is added language because barbers are not allowed to work on anyone with these problems.

12. Proposed changes to NAC 643.430 – change 12th grade to high school diploma.

NAC 643.430 Qualifications of applicant for student's license.

1. An applicant for a license as a student must:

(a) Have completed the ~~12th grade~~ high school diploma or an equivalent; and

(b) Be an American citizen or lawfully entitled to live and work in the United States.

2. If the applicant has ever been convicted of a felony, he must appear before the board for a hearing to determine whether he will be permitted to enroll in a barber school. A person who has been convicted of a felony or a crime of moral turpitude has the burden of showing that a student's license should be issued. The board will consider the date of conviction, the nature of the crime, the applicant's record of rehabilitation, the applicant's experience since conviction, personal and employment references and any other evidence which the board deems relevant.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., part Rule S-18, eff. 10-8-70; A 2-26-80]

This NAC is being changed due to the fact that there are now certificates of attendance. When this was written years ago it was the intent of the Board for an applicant to graduate from high school. This is the same as the barber but this is for the student license.

13. Proposed changes to NAC 643.440 – adding specific language.

NAC 643.440 Physical examinations.

1. No student will receive a student's license or be permitted to enroll in a barber school while he has an infectious, contagious or communicable disease.

2. Each student must undergo a physical examination, including a one-step TB test or a chest X-ray, blood test and any other test which the board considers necessary before a student's license will be issued.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., part Rule S-18, eff. 10-8-70; A 2-26-80]

After much discussion on this. Mr. Azzam our Health Officer thought that we should have TB screening test and take out one-step. This was decided on.

14. Proposed changes to NAC 643.450 – removing number 2 according to NRS 643.1777

NAC 643.450 Instructor's license: Examination. (NRS 643.050)

1. An examination for an instructor's license will be given not more than twice a year and will consist of written questions pertaining to all phases of the science of barbering, the management of a barbershop, ethics, salesmanship, applicable state laws and regulations, and any other questions the board may deem required of instructors. Applicants will also be required to pass questions on teaching in the classroom and oral practical instruction on any or all phases of practical barbering services which the board may prescribe.

~~2. A minimum of three members of the board will be present to administer the instructor's examination.~~

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., part Rule S-16, eff. 10-8-70; A 2-8-76]—(NAC A by R084-99, 1-18-2000)

This is being changed due to the fact that in the 2015 Legislature session the law was changed from the Board administrating the instructor exam to use NIC to administer the instructor's exam. This is old language.

15. Proposed removal of NAC 643.510 – Outdated.

~~NAC 643.510 Posting of sign concerning free services and materials. Signs must be conspicuously posted in all barber schools which state that:~~

- ~~1. There is no charge for services rendered by students;~~
- ~~2. The tipping of students or instructors is not allowed; and~~
- ~~3. There is no charge for materials or linens used by the students.~~

~~[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule S-5, eff. 10-8-70]~~

This is being repealed because this is outdated and the NRS says otherwise. This is a cleanup for language.

16. Proposed removal of NAC 643.540 – outdated

~~NAC 643.540 – Ashtrays and cuspidors.~~

- ~~1. Sufficient ashtrays must be provided and must be cleaned every day.~~
- ~~2. Cuspidors are prohibited in barber schools.~~
- ~~[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule S 8, eff. 10-8-70]~~

This is being changed for old language. No one has cuspidors in barber schools anymore.

17. Proposed changes to NAC 643.550 - Modifications to waste receptacles.

~~NAC 643.550 A At least two covered waste receptacles must be provided for each workstand. All single use items including neck strips must be discarded immediately after a single use. Used shaving papers, paper towels and neck strips must be deposited in one receptacle and used linens and towels must be deposited in the other.~~

This is the same language that was changed for the barber shop it will mirror the barber school.

18. Proposed changes to NAC 643.570 – removal of dry fumigant and add updated language.

~~NAC 643.570 Sterilization~~ Disinfection of implements.

All non-porous implements must be cleaned and disinfected prior to each use by the following steps:

1. Each item must be cleaned with soap or detergent and water and rinsed. Blade wash is an acceptable cleaner for this step.
2. Item(s) must be fully immersed (including handles) in an EPA registered disinfectant that is bactericidal, virucidal and fungicidal. Disinfectant must be used in accordance with the manufactures label, including contact time. EPA registered disinfectants that are in a spray or wipe form are also acceptable if manufactures label instructions are followed.
3. Items must be rinsed and dried with a clean towel or allowed to air dry.

Electrical Implements

1. Remove hair and other debris.
2. Use EPA registered disinfectant spray or wipe that is bactericidal, virucidal and fungicidal according to the manufactures label, including contact time.

3. Wipe dry with clean towel.

Storage of Implements.

1. When items have been properly disinfected, they must be stored in a clean, covered container or drawer until used.
2. Electrical implements may be stored on hooks, stands or a clean covered container or closed drawer.
3. No implements may be carried in clothing, tool belts or pockets.

~~1. Combs, razors, scissors, brushes, blades for clippers, neck dusters, tweezers, parts of vacuums and vibrators, and all other implements which come in contact with the skin or hair of the head, face or neck must be immersed in a germicidal solution or kept in a closed airtight compartment which is equipped with a germicidal vapor or light immediately before each use.~~

- ~~— 2. For each barber's chair in a barber school, there must be provided:~~
- ~~— (a) A container of sufficient depth for the immersion of those implements listed in subsection 1. The container must contain a solution of not less than 4 percent formalin or 5 percent phenol, or the equivalent.~~
- ~~— (b) An airtight cabinet sterilizer equipped with:~~
- ~~— (1) A small glass or glass tray containing 1 tablespoon of borax and 1 tablespoon of formaldehyde;~~

This is the same language that was changed for the barber shop it will mirror the barber school.

19. Proposed removal to NAC 643.590 – In more than once.

~~NAC 643.590 Containers for hair. Hair must be kept in a separate closed container before disposal.~~

~~— [Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., part Rule S-7, eff. 10-8-70]~~

This is the same language that was changed for the barber shop it will mirror the barber school.

20. Proposed changes to NAC 643.645 – Adding updated language.

NAC 643.645 Prohibition against removal of warts, moles and blemishes. A student or an instructor may not remove by any method, warts, moles or skin blemishes of any kind. Students or instructors shall not perform a service when the area to be worked on has skin that is open, reddened, ulcerated or swollen.

[Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., Rule S-21, eff. 10-8-70]

This is the same language that was changed for the barber shop it will mirror the barber school.

21. Proposed changes to NAC 643.736 – raising time limit.

NAC 643.736 Courses for cosmetologists: Time for completion; hours of instruction.

1. The 400 hours of instruction for cosmetologists must be completed within 60 75 business days after the first date of enrollment.

2. A student enrolled in such instruction may not receive more than 8 hours of instruction in 1 day or more than 40 hours of instruction in 1 week.

(Added to NAC by Barbers' Health & Sanitation Bd., eff. 5-19-88)

This is being changed because it was brought to our attention from an individual. They wanted to see this changed. Mr. Marcus Allen owner of Masterpiece Barber College stated that before the change there was ample time to finish the course. But, Mr. Allen stated he was fine with this change because it gave the student more lead way to finish the school.



Ms. Maestas wanted on the record that she did receive 2 different emails that stated they were in favor of all changes. These were from Licensed Barbers.


There was no public comment at this time.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to adjourn this Public Workshop and meeting, Mr. Azzam seconded the motion and all was in favor.


There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned.
