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NEVADA STATE BARBER'S HEALTH and SANITATION BOARD



Minutes – October 6, 2019 – Regular Business Meeting

President Nathaniel LaShore called the meeting to order on Sunday, August 11, 2019, the time was 4:30 P.M. at the Masterpiece Barber School, located at 3510 East Bonanza Road, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Board members Ms. Nancy Hathaway, Mr. Nathaniel LaShore, Mr. Johnnie Williams, Mr. Ishan Azzam and Antinette Maestas.

The agenda was reviewed and approved as posted. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to approve the agenda and Mr. Williams seconded. There was discussion on this item. Ms. Antinette Maestas stated that there was a typo on the location it was posted as Barber College and it should be Barber School. She stated that it had already been corrected. All was in favor.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes for the August 11, 2019 Business Meeting since everyone had copies and they had been read. The motion included to accept the minutes as submitted. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Ms. Hathaway made a motion to dispense of the reading of the 1st quarter financial report, Mr. Williams seconded and all was in favor.

Officers Report

1. Ms. Hathaway reported that she has been busy up North. Doing business as usual. Starting this week they have several new shops opening. There are several individual suites going in.
2. Mr. LaShore reported that he has been doing business as usual. Staying busy inspecting. Making sure that the consumers are protected. He reported that he has been following up on complaints.
3. Mr. Johnnie Williams has been busy and he has been doing inspections. He states that several of the individual suites barbers are never there.
4. Mr. Ihsan Azzam reported that Nevada has had a few cases of the vaping problems in Nevada. He shared that the vaping devise is drowning the lungs. There are 18 deaths in the United States from this. There are 3 in southern Nevada and 1 in Northern Nevada.

Old Business – Ms. Maestas reported that it was a great conference. There was some great information. She stated that it was reported that over the next 10 years they anticipate over 40,000 jobs would be lost in Las Vegas due to robotics and automation. Barbers were on the list that their jobs would not be effected by this problem. There was great information shared on sanitation. There was a NABBA lab and 9 of Nevada’s instructors attended.

New Business

Ms. Maestas swore all the individuals for hearing in.

Perry Douglas hearing – Mr. Douglas wants to go to school and has a felony on his record. He has 2 felonies on his record. The first one was in 2005 for robbery he did 2 years in prison. The second one was 2015 for a DUI. He did 1 year in jail. He is still on parole, he should be done November 25, 2019. He just got out of rehab at the Freedom House. All his paperwork was in order. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to start school and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Lawrence Harrison hearing – Mr. Harrison came before the Board to be able to attend school in the State of Nevada. He does have a felony on his record. In 2015 he got a felony for conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute laundering conspiracy. He served 2 years in prison. He finished probation on November 29, 2018. All his paperwork was in order. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to start school and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Dustin O’Dell hearing – Mr. O’Dell came before the board to be able to attend school. He has 2 felonies on his record. In 2011 he got a felony for fleeing He did 3 months in county jail. He got out and got a DUI did 1 year in prison, and 2 years of probation. He was released from probation August of 2016. He did many programs while in prison. All his paperwork was in order. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to start school and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Moshe Banner hearing – Mr. Banner came before the board because he wants to go to school. He has a felony on his record. The felony was in April 2015. He made a mistake and it was for burglary. He broke into a house. He did 2 years on probation with no jail time. He was done with probation since 2017. He did not have his release of probation. Ms. Hathaway asked if he could get the release paperwork from his probation officer by October 15, 2019 and turn it in. The Board gave Ms. Maestas permission to accept this document from Mr. Banner. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow Mr. Banner to attend school as long as he turns the release paper into Ms. Maestas. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Kevin Koo – Mr. Koo came before the Board because he is over on his apprenticeship. He was issued an apprentice license on February 8, 2018, he should have taken the August or October 2019. He turned in an incomplete application and it was after the deadline. The owner of where he was working did not notarize the statement of work experience. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to pull Mr. Koo’s license and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Steven Velasquez – Mr. Velasquez came before the Board because he is over on his apprenticeship. He was issued a license on December 15, 2017, he should have taken the August or October 2019 exam. Ms. Maestas explained to the Board that Mr. Velasquez came into the office on September 14, the day before the deadline. He did pick up an application but he had not had his TB test. He never returned to the office. He told the Board that he we just show up for the hearing and plead his case. His letter that he received stated that he had to have a TB test to come early to pick up the application to be able to

make the deadline. Mr. Velasquez stated that he accepts all responsibility for not reading the letter all the way through. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to suspend his license and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Juan Kuraica – Mr. Kuraica did not show for the hearing. He was issued a license December 15, 2018, he should have taken the January or April 2019 exam. He was sent letters and we never heard from him. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to suspend her license, Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Jarell Palad – Mr. Palad did not show for the hearing. He was issued a license December 22, 2017, he should have taken the August or October 2019 exam. He was sent letters and we never heard from him. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to suspend her license, Mr. Williams seconded the motion and all was in favor.

Eddie Santos– Mr. Santos came before the Board because he wants to go to school. He has a felony on his record. In April of 2014 he received a felony for possession with attempt to sell. He was sentence to probation for 3 years and finished in 2 years 2016. He has an honorable discharge. All his paperwork was in order. Ms. Hathaway made a motion to allow him to start school providing he agrees to random drug testing and Mr. Williams seconded the motion all was in favor.

Jordan Urquiaga, Don Hudson, Darrain Huffy, and Pedro Chairez no showed for hearing.

Gregory Bass, Jose Carrillo, Travion Ireland, Kaika Kamelamela, Javier Rodriguez, Marco Ruiz, Vireak Sar Jr., Quinton Smith, Acey Walker and Evan Walton took the exam and no need to hear them.

Schedule for the upcoming year 2020 – Examinations



Public Comment


Ms. Hathaway made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Mr. Azzam seconded and all was in favor.


There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned.


